## Permitted Material Under Part 61

FLIGHT DUTY TIMES. Both 'CAO 48.0/48.1.

**NOT PERMITTED** Dictionaries, English translators, recording devices, commercially published or homemade content pages and indexes for Regs Documents etc, manuals, publications, text, training books, notes, blank paper etc, electronic devices, electronic Flight Planning computers/devices.

**DIVIDERS** Only blank Airservices produced section dividers of permitted publications may be used

SELF PRINTED COPIES of CASRs, CARs, CAOs, CAAPs and Visual Flight Rules Guide (VFRG – only for PPL and RPL exams) downloaded from the CASA website are acceptable IF: The documents are approved for use in that exam AND are secured in a RING BOUNDED folder or similar, they MUST NOT BE LOOSE sheets, AND The CASRs, CARs, CAOs, CAAPs and VFG are EACH in a clearly marked folder (e.g. CAR 1988) that do not contain other documents, notes or material, no larger than A4

CASA DOES NOT APPROVE use of downloaded air publications such as AIP Book, ERSA, DAPS, etc.

**UNDERLINING AND HIGHLIGHTING** provided these do not include any form of notations.

TAGGGING Maximum number of tags AIP -15 tags ERSA -5 tags

MARKING AND TAGGING NOT PERMITTED IN (i) CAR (1988), (ii) CASR (1998), (iii) CASR Part 61 and (iv) CASR Part 137, CAO, Day VFR Guide, DAP East and West, CAAP, Handbook and Operations Manual of exam aircraft model, All charts, Any exam-permitted publication not listed here

PAGE TAGS must not carry more than just the topic headings of the page or section in English THE CAR airservices has no dividers for CAR (1988), you can use self-produced section divider coloured card or similar and only write eg. 'Vol 2 - Part 5'. Each of the 5 section volumes may be secured in clearly marked folder (e.g. Vol 2 - Part 5).

**AIP COMPLETE** includes: AIP Book, including AIP SUP. (ERSA) and RDS, D&A Procedures (DAP) East and West, All TAC's, All ERC's Low and High, AUS PCA.

AIP BOOK refers only to Part 1 GEN, Part 2 ENR, Part 3 AD, Index and any AIP SUP

THE VFRG is permitted for PPL and RPL exams only.

**Note:** The VFRG referred to here is that **document produced by CASA and not by a third party.** 

**ERSA**, 'complete' also includes the Runway Distances Supplement. ERSA 'complete' is **only required for CPL and ATPL exams**.

**NAV EQUIPMENT When permitted**, includes: Dividers, compass, protractor, ruler (or straight-edge).

**ONLY ONE** non-electronic 'aviation wind triangle and circular slide rule' computer. eg Jeppesen Sanderson CR or other brands of similar type or a manual slide rule (if the candidate so prefers it).

**ELECTRONIC CALULATORS** If on the permitted materials - a 'Basic calculator' which only has: four functions  $(+, -, x \text{ and } \div)$ , a square root function  $(\sqrt{})$ , a single memory, a percentage key (%) is optional. It must **not be** programmable or do CAS/TAS/MN conversions or solving of aviation type problems. Aspeq will maintain their stock of calculators which they can lend if batteries go flat.

**STANDARD EQUIPMENT** A pen, pencil and eraser, and a ruler **will be provided by the Invigilator**.
